ACGC is a an interdenominational and evangelical mission organization operating as an umbrella of three ministries i.e. Antioch, NCIST and Pamoja Africa.

Nairobi College of Intercultural Studies and Theology registered under company and society Act Cap 208,we train pastors and missionaries from within and outside the country preparing them for the service of the kingdom. In the past we have trained students from Zambia,Sudan,Ethiopia and Uganda, from Kenya we have from Samburu.

Antioch ministry commissions the trained pastors and missionaries to take up the Great Commission "...Therefore go and make disciples of all nations..."(Matt 28:16-18) and "...Brothers if you have a message of encouragement please speak..."(Acts 13:15)

In Pamoja Africa we support missionaries who establish kingdom businesses and converse with others who would want to serve with their possessions.



Rev. Calum McLeod who is currently serving the Free Church of Scotland since 2008, and holds a Master degree in Divinity (Distinction), was the lecturer of the one week block course held in January 2010.
